Joe O'Connor opened the first J.M. O'Connor office in Wichita, KS in 1920. The company specialized in equipment for mechanical systems. Joe emphasized engineering skills in the staff he hired and today JMO maintains a strong culture of engineering expertise and excellence. JMO featured a diverse product offering. In addition to hydronics the company also sold forced-air unitary HVAC systems, air filtration systems, and controls.

Bob Piller, Joe's son-in-law, joined JMO in 1949 and became President of the company after Joe retired. During this time O'Connor's hydronics and forced-air HVAC divisions split into separate companies. The hydronics division retained the name J.M. O'Connor. Bob successfully led the business until the end of the 1980's when his son, Lynn took over as President. In 1994 JMO expanded into Kansas City and became a regional distributor for Taco Pumps.

Sales Manager Warren Jurgens has driven the expansion of JMO's commercial plan & spec rep business, focusing on education for

the engineer and contractor base, as well as comprehensive training for all the JMO salespeople– tying in with our core values of education and engineering excellence in all our work. Today, JMO looks to the future with a staff of young people, including Lynn's son Jim, who joined JMO in 2019.

Getting To Know You....Sean Devins, Warehouse Manager/Pump Assembly



Product Spotlight: Taco 1600 Series Custom and Stock Pump Models

Ever have a customer who has a custom Taco 1600 Series pump and they can't wait for a new pump to be assembled? In addition to manufacturing a line of custom 1600 Series model numbers that have varying horsepower options for each model, Taco also offers 1600 Series "stock" pump numbers that each come with a set HP and impeller trim size and are ready to ship.





Did you know that these custom and stock models are often interchangeable?

The chart to the right shows each custom 1600 Pump Model in the column on the left, with all 1600 stock model options to the right. So, if the Taco pump selector recommends a 1611 pump with a 1/3HP motor and 4.75" impeller, you could instead use the Taco stock 1610 model in it's place which comes boxed and ready to install! The performance is the same and actually, the two pumps are identical! Similarly, if a customer needs a 1635 pump with a 3/4HP motor and a maximum 5.65" impeller, you could instead use the Taco stock 1632 model in it's place. And vice-versa!
