normally closed and can be used in a wide variety of heating and condensing cooling applications, primarily designed for use with baseboard, fan coils, radiators, convectors, air handlers, heat pumps and radiant applications.

The Zone Sentry zone valve line is available in several different styles for use in various applications. The Geo-Sentry Geothermal zone valve is especially suited for use in either open or closed loop geothermal systems with water source heat pumps. The Taco Potable Water Zone Sentry is available for use in a combination domestic water and hydronic heating system, culinary installation or water shut off to a potable system. The Multi-Volt Zone Sentry Zone Valve is for use in heating or cooling applications and accepts input voltages between 120 and 277VAC 50/60HZ. It is designed for use in hydronic HVAC systems, primarily in fan coils and air handlers, or other HVAC systems where a quality line voltage zone valve is required.

The newest addition to Taco's zone valve line of products is the QuickTop Zone Valve. This is Taco's answer to an affordable replacement for normallyclosed, synchronous motor zone valves. It can be used in a wide variety of heating and cooling applications such as baseboard, fan coils, radiators, convectors, air handlers, heat pumps and radiant applications.


